I told them that my two boys hadn't made it down to the bottom yet and that I had lost sight of them. The gentleman asked me to describe them and as soon as I did he explained to me that the Ski Patrol had already located them and was helping.

What had happened was my youngest while trying to get back on a main trail had become stuck on an icy trail and lost a ski and a pole. His older brother stayed with him and tried to help until the Ski Patrol was alerted (I'm proud of him as well).

You're team (Ski School and Ski Patrol) helped to avert what could have been a major issue which could have turned worse quickly. As it was, my oldest did suffer from some minor frost nip.

I can't be more grateful and am full of gratitude for helping my family today. I never got the names of the people from Ski Patrol nor Ski School who helped, but your team here is amazing. They even went back and located his missing ski on the Icy (I believe closed) trail. I'm sure this wasn't a big deal to the Ski Patrol but to us, it was.
